

COMPLETION RULES FOR CHAMPIONSHIP

1. All games to be played under rules of An Cumann Camogáiochta.
2. Results must be sent to league co-ordinator within 48 hours to claim the points. The name of the referee must be included with the score.
3. Problems with fixtures / re-scheduling of fixtures must go through fixtures committee and be refixed if necessary by same. Teams cannot agree between themselves to call off a game.
4. All fixtures must be played on or before the appointed date unless a pitch is unplayable / unavailable or there is a club bereavement. If home pitch is unavailable / unplayable the game is to be played in opposition pitch.
5. In the event of a tie for Championship positions between two teams a play off will decide.
6. Finals to be played at a venue arranged by the fixtures committee.
7. If a semi-final or final ends in a draw 10 mins extra time must be played.
8. Semi Finals: The final championship placing will decide who qualifies for the semi-finals with the top two teams gaining home advantage with semi-final 1 v 4 and 2 v 3 to be played to a finish. In the event of a draw ten minutes each way extra time.
9. Any team that withdraws after closing date for entries or during any competition will be fined €50. The Fixtures Committee will inform the County Secretary who will inform the Transfers, Hearings & Disciplinary Committee who will administer the fine on behalf of the county board.
10. First named team has home fixture, home team pays the referee.
11. The referee cannot be a player, mentor or registered member of either camogie club.
12. The Fixtures Committee reserves the right to alter fixtures if necessary.

2. Clubs must ensure that their team officials are aware of the eligibility and registration of all members of their teams particularly rule

"28.4. A player must meet the following age criteria in order to be eligible to participate in competitions:

U12 Be Under 12 and Over 8

U14 Be Under 14 and Over 10

U16 Be Under 16 and Over 12

U18 Be Under 18 and Over 14

Adult Be Over 15 except in the case of inter-county competitions where a player must be over 16

'Under' means that a player must be under the age limit by midnight on the 31st December of the year prior to the Championship year e.g. to play U16 a player must be aged 15 years or under on the 31st December prior to the Championship year.

'Over' means a player must be over the age limit by midnight 31st December of the year prior to the Championship (e.g. to play under 14 a player must be 10 years of age on the 31st December prior to the Championship year)."

Please note U15 be Under 15 and Over 11

U13 be Under 13 and Over 9 on the 31st of December 2010

3. Clubs are reminded that they are responsible for their supporters, all supporters, mentors and officials must show respect to the referee's, interference with referees will not be tolerated. Any issues regarding referees must be referred to the county secretary for investigation and not raised directly with the referee.
4. Incidents recorded in a referees report are automatically referred to the THDC for investigation.
5. Clubs are asked to show respect to each other's players, officials and supporters, if a team has an issue with the opposing team they should bring it to the attention of the referee or officer of the county board directly.
6. The county board will be contacting referee's directly but clubs are also asked to highlight to their referee's, mentors & players that camogie playing rules will be strictly enforced by referee's, a number of rules are particularly highlighted.

"20.23. A player may not:

a. Shoulder, push, trip, catch, hold or pull down an opponent;

b. Charge, back into or obstruct an opponent;

d. "dig" an opponent with the camán;

e. Chop, i.e. strike downwards on an opponent's camán;

g. Use the camán in a dangerous manner;

i. Tap opponent's camán other than as permitted in Rule 20.21 (d).

20.25. A player may not:

a. Engage in any form of rough or dangerous play;

b. Show dissent with any decisions;

c. Use abusive language. "

6. Referee's must receive teams sheets, which they must send with their referee's reports to the county secretary within 6 days from the match (signed scanned copies will be acceptable). Referees must list subs on the report.
